Pastor: As part of the council/ consistory, together with the elders and deacons I lead God's people in sharing the gospel. We work together to care for the church and for the spiritual growth of God's people.

Reader 1: Elders and pastors, thank you serving for faithfully, studying God's Word, overseeing the church, and encouraging spiritual growth in all members.

Reader 2: Let's pray together: Great God, please pour out your Holy Spirit on all of us. Fill us with grace and power for whatever ministry you've called us to or will call us to in the future.

Please guide these leaders; keep them strong and faithful; and give each of them wisdom, courage, discretion, and kindness so that they can serve you well.

Reader 3: We pray that your whole church will live together in unity, through Jesus Christ our Savior, who taught us to pray, saying:

heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth, as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts as welforgive our debtors. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For yours is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen.
